The meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m.

After a moment of prayer and approval of the agenda, Elvia introduced our new County Councilman, Chuck Ferrar. Chuck gave us background on himself and the state of the county budget. He then asked for questions from the residents regarding their concerns. Discussion ensued about the developer impact taxes, benefits and vesting of county employees, as well as state and federal money available for the projects we have going on in Oyster Harbor – living shorelines, bulkhead replacement, dredging, and storm water management. Chuck stated that he would like to work with us on helping to get money for these projects.

Bea Poulin spoke about the Homeless Day event the county is putting on this weekend and how citizens can donate items for the homeless. She also encouraged residents to attend the County Executives presentation of the County budget on May 3, 2010. She also spoke about the resources available for funding for the various OHCA projects and tax credits available for private property owners to curb stormwater runoff on their properties – rain barrels, rain gardens, etc.

The agenda was modified to allow Winston Dunkley, II to speak about his concern of neighborhood speeding and residents parking in no parking zones. David Ginsburg assured Winston Jr. that we would raise these issues and possible solutions at our next Board meeting.

Ian provided the President's report updating the community on the roads and bulkhead projects. He also presented the financial statements noting that we are in good shape financially. The Community Yard Sale will be held on April 10, 2010 from 9-2. Sales will be held on individual yards and dumpsters will be available for residents to throw out what is not sold.

Kim Boris updated the residents on the Green Committee. Rain barrels will be delivered on April 22th for those that placed an order. Recycling and compost bins are available for free and will be delivered on April 22, Earth Day. Please let Kim know if you need either of these so she knows how many to pickup. The next Green Committee meeting will be held on April 1 at 7:00 at Kim's house.
