ELECTION PROCEDURES

Registration begins at 7 p.m. and voting at 7:30 p.m. In order to vote you must be over 18 years of age, and a property owner in Oyster Harbor. You will be asked to show identification such as a drivers' license and your name will be checked off of a copy of the most recent tax roll. You will be given one ballot package regardless of how many properties you own in Oyster Harbor.

The nomination committee's slate will be presented and nominations from the floor will be accepted as well. Retiring officers and board members may run for any office.

Voting for the officers will occur first. As those votes are being counted by the volunteer vote counters (none of whom may be a person who is running for office), voting for the Board candidates will begin.

Votes will be counted immediately so results will be known immediately. A board containing all candidates' names will be at the front of the room and vote counts will be presented to the meeting participants on that board.

All votes must be counted by 8:15 p.m., so please arrive early.

After the Election

Committee Chairs are NOT elected but are appointed by the President after the election. We have had great Chairs and committee members and Oyster Harbor reflects their efforts. We hope that the present Chairs and committee members will continue or that many of you will chose to chair a committee or join a committee where vacancies need to be filled.

President's Report

It's hard to believe it's September already! Where did the summer go?

Fall in Oyster Harbor means beautiful sunrises and sunsets, flocking birds over the bay, rockfish, bluefish, a general winding down of summer activities and visitors. And, of course, Fall also means the possibility of severe weather. And, we've already seen our fair share between Irene and last week's deluge of rain. The good news is that, more than ever before, our streets and swales can handle the rain. In fact, this is the first time in my 18 years here that Shore Drive did not flood--and we got an enormous amount of rain! The less good news is that the hurricane season is just upon us, for all practical purposes. So, we should all continue to be diligent and prepared. On that note, OHCA will be leaving sandbags in place along Shore Drive and the bulkhead--probably until spring. They should help to contain small surges, hold back sand, and protect right of way. Please do not play with them or remove them!

On this note, I want to extend a HUGE THANK YOU to Brooke Doswell--our outgoing president. Under her leadership this year (during which time, she operated remotely from 500 miles away), OHCA accomplished a tremendous amount: we finally resolved the paving/asphalting debacle we'd been dealing with; we are well into the process of replacing the bulkhead--no easy task because of politics, permitting, and cost; we have contained flooding on Shore Drive by raising the road, re-paving, and re-swaling. These are enormous projects, and OHCA is truly grateful and appreciative of Brooke's commitment, dedication, and tenacity to bettering our community. Thank you, again, Brooke--for everything. You will be missed!

I want to also thank Jo Burkholder for her years of service and commitment. She started as VP, and for the past 6 years has been the Community Property Chair—one of our most active and proactive committees, because of Jo's leadership. Jo will be stepping down as Community Property Chair—she will be greatly missed! Bob Eyster has graciously accepted the Community Property Chair position.

Elections will be held Tuesday, September 27th. Gerald Winegrad and the Nominating Committee have been hard at work trying to line up candidates. It is a slow, tedious process...thank you to those who have stepped forward. This is probably one of the best times to get involved in the OHCA--things are running smoothly (knock on wood), the community seems to be in general agreement about priorities, there is strong communication and cooperation between the board and officers. Green Committee

It has been a busy summer of planning. Our Watershed Stewards group has worked with the County to install tandem rain barrels on the pumping station at the entrance of our community. This will help the roof water to drain at a slower pace. Soon, gutters and two rain barrels will be installed on the shed at the Harbor lot as a demonstration area.

We have also been planning a few projects to be implemented in September. A no-mow zone has been installed at the entrance of our community. **A huge thank you to Anne Arundel County who donated the soil and mulch that we needed!** At Fishing Creek Park, a native garden will be planted by the fence to help minimize nitrogen and bacteria levels that enter the Fishing Creek waterway. This will get

underway on Saturday, September 24th. We invite your family and friends to come learn about and help our environment. These are projects that can be duplicated on your property! Please join us in the installation process that will follow.

Aside from the Watershed Steward projects, the much anticipated Shore Drive swale planting will take place on a Saturday in October. More information will come later. Your help is needed! There are over 500 linear feet of swale to be planted! No planting experience is necessary so join us for some fun! Planting plans for the swales will be available for your viewing at the September election meeting.

Dumpsters – Oct 31 to Nov 2

The County provided dumpsters will be in the Harbor Lot from October 31 to November 2. If you didn't get a chance to clean out in July, here is another chance to get rid of the unwanted items in your home. Please be sure that your items are placed in the dumpster and not beside it. If you cannot fit items in the dumpster or are unavailable during that time, please call Anne Arundel County for FREE bulk trash pickup. Below is the information for pick-up

- Call (410) 222-6100, Monday through Friday, between 7:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to schedule collection
- Items must be ready at the curb by 6 a.m. on the scheduled collection day.
- Cancellations must be received 48-hours prior to the scheduled collection date.
- Only those items specifically requested for collection will be picked up.
- Be sure items are not obstructed by vehicles, fences, or other structures. Always place items on the curb.

September is National Preparedness Month 2011

Recent local responses to Hurricane Irene demonstrated the value of preparedness at all levels. The success of preparedness is measured in safety and a successful response.

Director of Annapolis Emergency management, Kevin Simmons, advises that, *“Emergency managers and first responders hold exercises and then evaluate what went well and where there is room for improvement. You can review your own preparedness for recent events and we all can learn lessons about being better prepared next time. Preparedness for all of us always begins at home.”* The better prepared individuals, families and businesses are the better prepared the whole community is to recover from a disaster. Keep in mind the recent successful and orderly evacuation of Ocean City.

FEMA Administrator, Craig Fugate, frequently reminds us that we are all partners in preparedness and response and communities respond and recover together. The best way to support your local responders is to be as prepared as possible to take care of yourself and your family.

Think about what you would do to prepare for a hurricane with a greater impact than Irene. Hurricane season lasts through the month of November. Are you ready for a larger local evacuation? Review your plans with your family. Do you have a family communications plan? Are you prepared for the routine medical needs, special needs and the needs of children and pets? Do you check on neighbors who might need help? Have you planned with your family and your neighbors? Do you know about generator safety and to keep your generator well outside of the house and well outside of the garage? Do you know that means at least 15 feet away from the house and the garage?

Preparedness for one type of hazard really does prepare you for other types of disasters. For information on planning and preparing go to www.annapolis.gov/oem or www.aacounty.org/oem.

In addition to a quarterly newsletter, Oyster Harbor provides updates to residents via email blasts to your inbox. These blasts are only done when necessary to communicate important upcoming events, security alerts, safety concerns with regards to bad weather or other important information that the Board feels residents should be aware of. They are minimal so your inbox is not clogged with unnecessary emails.

If you are interested in receiving these updates, please email manager@oysterharbor.org with the email address where you would like to receive OHCA information. Your privacy will be maintained and your email will not be shared with any outside parties.

SECURITY ALERT

Since early spring there have been multiple burglaries and attempted thefts between the both Oyster Harbor and Arundel on the Bay neighborhoods. An increase in crime during this time is not unusual as more residents leave their doors and windows open in the warmer weather.

The community is asking that you do the following to prevent the theft of you and your neighbor's personal property:

- **REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY** - When you call to report suspicious persons of activity, you may not only aid the police, you make your community a safer place to live. Some obvious signs to look for:
 - A stranger entering your neighbor's house when it is unoccupied. Let your neighbors know when you will be out of town.
 - Anyone removing accessories, license plates or gas from a vehicle.
 - Anyone peering into parked cars may be looking for a car to steal or for valuables displayed inside.
 - A sound of breaking glass or loud explosive noises could mean an accident, burglary, or vandalism.
 - Persons loitering in the neighborhood who do not live there could be burglars.
 - Anyone forcing entrance to, or tampering with a residence, business or vehicle should be reported.
 - Persons walking casually through the neighborhood looking into cars, backyards, etc.
 - Persons taking a shortcut through a backyard. They may have broken into someone's home.
 - Parked, occupied vehicles that contain one or more persons. If it is an unusual hour the occupants may be lookouts for a burglary.
 - Vehicles moving slowly and without lights or following an aimless or repetitive course. Particularly in the areas of schools, parks, and playgrounds. The occupants may be searching for a place to rob or burglarize, or they may be involved in drug or sex offenses.

- **SECURE YOUR HOME AND VEHICLE**
 - Give your home the appearance of occupancy at all times.
 - At night, leave on outdoor lights. Effective lighting over doorways and garages, and strategically placed floodlights (particularly those with motion detectors), add to prevention measures.
 - Windows and doors should be securely locked. Inadequate locks should be replaced or supplemented.
 - Shrubbery should not obscure doors and windows.
 - Lock your vehicle upon exiting and make sure that valuables are kept out of sight.
