The the project is located entirely within the Critical Area and is mostly located within a forested nontidal wetland and stream (Fishing Creek). The project will permanently impact forested nontidal wetlands, 25-foot nontidal wetland buffer and waterway (Fishing Creek). It is not known at this time if any RTE species are located within the proposed project area. The project will not affect tidal wetlands. The area is located within the Tidal Floodplain of Fishing Creek which is not regulated by the State of Maryland. All proposed permanent impacts will require mitigation at a 2-to-1 ratio. Mitigation will be required to satisfy both State (MDE) and Federal (Corps) mitigation rules and regulations. This project qualifies as a Permit under COMAR and will need a Public Notice. A nontidal wetland delineation will need to be conducted and should be reviewed by both MDE and CORPS prior to submission of an Joint Permit Application (Application). A robust justification of project need, alternative site analysis and avoidance/minimization discussion must be included with the Application which will be reviewed by both the State and the Corps. A strong statement must be provided with supporting evidence why impacts to the nontidal wetlands cannot be avoided and how any proposed impacts have been minimized to the greatest extent possible. The MDE Waterway Construction Engineer has not provided comments for this report and should be contacted for comments regarding waterway/stream and 100-year FEMA floodplain. NOTE: The project will also require a Water Quality Certification.

(refer to MDE Compliance Complaint #58757, found in AI #124968). Mr Louis stated that the currently approved Compliance remediation plan was not acceptable to the local residents and Mr. Louis proposed a change of plans during the meeting as shown in pre-application notes submitted to MDE. MDE stated that the Wetlands and Waterway Protection Program could not discuss the Compliance matter and, that if they had problems with the approved remediation plan they must discuss with MDE Compliance Division. Mr. DaVia stated that a new Joint Permit Application for the proposed project will not be entertained by the Corps until the active enforcement action has been resolved and settled between all parties and MDE. Both MDE and Anne Arundel County stated support of this statement. Mr. Day stated Mr. Anderson will need to apply to the County for development authorization/license. Anne Arundel County should determine if the proposed project can move forward prior to the submission of a Joint Permit Application.
